
Transcribed from William Bonell family Bible August 2013

Note: this Bible, which is in poor condition, has extensive writing inside both covers and elsewhere in several different hands. It almost looks like it was used to practice signing names in. Some of the writing is very clear; some is not. A few pages are torn with parts missing. The ink is faded on most pages. Pasted in, on relatively clean pages, are the register of births, the register of deaths, and the family registers.
